## **Immersion Program**

#### Specialized English Classes

In one kind of English class, students learn about and practice the nuts and bolts of the English language with Japanese teachers of English. These classes give students the explanations and support they need in Japanese and build their confidence to try to use English.

#### Immersion Classes

There are three immersion subjects: Visual Art, Music and Integrated Study. In these classes, the targets are the content and skills of *the subject*, not the English language itself. However, students receive all is carefully designed so that students can use both what they are learning in English classes and their own problem-solving skills to understand their teachers and successfully carry out the tasks.
