Napier Girls' High School Students Visit Kosei Gakuen Girls'

This April a group of 13 students and two teachers from Napier Girls' High School arrived in Japan on a weeklong school trip. As the first formal arrangement of our new sister school partnership, the girls spent two nights on home-stay with families of Kosei Gakuen students. Their home-stay sisters then brought them to our school for a day of cultural exchange. The day started with a moving assembly hosted by KGGS 9th intake students Chisaki and Naho who returned from Napier Girls' in December last year.

At this assembly the group from Napier were welcomed with a rousing performance of the Maori song Pokarekareana performed by all of the students of Kosei Gakuen. The girls from Napier then performed two songs of their own in Maori and English. A representative of the group, also delivered a thoughtful and moving speech in Japanese which greatly impressed all of our students and staff members.

While here the girls participated in tea ceremony, calligraphy, art and music classes and had the chance to mingle with the girls of 1F for an Oral communication class. The KGGS 11th intake students took this opportunity to ask as many questions as they could about life in New Zealand. They also chatted about the Kiwi students' impressions of Japan and introduced various aspects of Japanese culture to them. At the end of the day, our students presented their new friends with a traditional Japanese toy, either a Kendama or a Koma, and the classroom was filled with laughter as the students attempted to master these games together.

After leaving our school the group from Napier travelled on to other destinations in Japan including Universal Studios in Osaka and the Peace Park in Hiroshima. Their visit proved to be a memorable experience for all at Kosei Gakuen. We hope that the girls who visited us on this trip enjoyed experiencing Japanese school life first hand and we look forward to welcoming another group from Napier Girls' High School in the near future.
