On Sunday the 7th of December, an excited crowd of parents and teachers gathered in the arrivals lounge of Narita airport to welcome back the forty-six girls of KGGS' 10th intake. These girls departed for New Zealand in January 2014 and have had many exciting adventures since then. The group had spent the previous two weeks studying at a language school in central Auckland, working to maximize their exam scores upon their return to Japan. While they were sad to leave their adopted homes across New Zealand's North Island, the students are also excited about embarking on the next stage of their journey, putting the knowledge that they have gained in New Zealand to use as they prepare to sit their university entrance exams.

A special assembly was held for the girls on the 13th of December in the school's main hall. At this assembly each student had a chance to make a PowerPoint presentation in English about her experiences in New Zealand. The presentations covered various topics, including living with a homestay family, Maori culture and the geography of various regions of New Zealand. Naturally, the girls were nervous about speaking in front of their parents, teachers and classmates, however they overcame their nerves to speak confidently and assertively. The girls of the KGGS 11th intake were also present and this was an invaluable chance for them to see just how much they can grow in a year.

The third term chorus contest is a highlight of the school year for many students, parents and teachers. Many classes have already started preparing for next term's contest.


