

Students Shine in Our 9th Annual Chorus Contest

This year's chorus contest was held on January 24th. In the first half, each of the junior high classes sang two songs: one in English ('Go the Distance' from the Disney movie 'Hercules') and a song of their own choice in Japanese. The week leading up to the contest many girls came down with a cold or the flu, but on the day itself, most students made it to the stage and sang their hearts out.

The 7th graders were the most keen to start practicing for the contest (they started in September!) and they made a very strong debut. The 8th graders kept wavering in their choice of free song, pianist and conductor, but the weeks leading up to the contest, they managed to find their feet and practiced with renewed determination. The 9th graders are always very busy with various other activities (their school trip, studying for the high school entrance exams) but it was clear they too wanted to do their best for this, the last event of their junior high life.

First prize went to 3-2, with 2-1 and 1-1 taking second and third respectively. Mai Miyazaki (3-2) took the best pianist award and, in somewhat of a coup, a 7th grader (Sawako Kojima from 1-2) took the best conductor award.

The second half of the contest was reserved, as always, for the high school students. The judges all felt the overall level was higher than ever before. Special mention must go to 1D who suddenly found themselves without a pianist last-minute. They decided to perform their song a cappella and the result was quite emotional.

For the first time in the history of the chorus contest at our school, two classes came out on top with exactly the same score: 2A ('Haru yo, koi') and 2B ('Akashi'). The second prize went to 2C ('Hajimari') and the third prize to 1A ('Anata e'). Ayaka Mamada got the best pianist award for her elegant, crystal-clear accompaniment to 'Haru yo, koi', and Minani Kamata took the best conductor award for leading her class in 'Hajimari' with unparalleled vision and power. Congratulations, not only to the winners, but to all classes for sharing their extraordinary music with us. It was a real treat!


