Second prize went to the 2E girls, whose conductor (Etsuko Hashimoto) got the top award in that category; and third prize went to the 2D class. We can't wait to see them again in December and to speak with them in English! Kia kaha!




NZ 留学:11期生が帰国し、12期生が出発しました!
