Kosei Gakuen Girls' Students Join Summer Camp in China

This year students from Kosei Gakuen Girls' High School had the opportunity to take part in a special summer camp in China and Inner-Mongolia. The camp, organized by a youth organization, is a yearly event which takes place during the summer vacation. Students from all over the world are invited to join, and this year's camp had over 300 participants from some 20 different countries!



It was a fantastic chance for our students to speak English in a natural context and make friends. Of course, there were also plenty of opportunities to learn about Chinese culture as well. The camp started in Beijing, before the group travelled together to Inner-Mongolia. During this long journey the students were able to observe the changing landscape and architecture. There were plenty of chances for sightseeing as well. The group visited the Great Wall of China and Tiananmen Square, among other historic and memorable places.



Activities included dances and performances by the students. This gave our students a chance to showcase Japanese culture and introduce their new friends to Japanese artists such as AKB48. There was also a nighttime fireworks display and the chance to join traditional folk activities.

Participating in this camp was a once in a lifetime experience, and the students made memories which they will no doubt remember for the rest of their lives!

The third grade high school classes made many different delicious foods for the school festival. There was a variety of savory and sweet foods to purchase. Class 3A made "baby castella" cakes with a variety of toppings such as chocolate, curry, and sausage with cheese. Class 3B made gyoza, a deep-fried dumpling with various fillings such as curry and sausage. Class 3C made dorayaki with different fillings including the classic red bean paste as well as chocolate and marshmallow. Class 3-D cooked up three types of wraps made with flour tortillas; teriyaki chicken, tuna and mayonnaise, and chocolate banana.
