and Creating a Peaceful World


On the 21st of February the students of Kosei Gakuen Girls' high school were lucky enough to have the chance to attend a special lecture by Akira Kawasaki of the Peace Boat organization and ICAN. Mr. Kawasaki told the students about how Peace Boat and ICAN are working to abolish nuclear weapons and create a more peaceful world. ICAN was the recipient of the 2017 Nobel Peace Prize for its efforts towards nuclear disarmament, and this was an amazing opportunity for the girls to hear about ICAN's work first hand. The students also heard about how the Peace Boat gives people all over the world the chance to talk with survivors of the Hiroshima and Nagasaki bombings. This helped them to appreciate how important it is to take in the words of such people, and to never forget what happened in 1945. The second year high school students will be travelling to Hiroshima on a school trip in mid-March. This important experience will no doubt have been made even more meaningful by the knowledge gained from Mr. Kawasaki's lecture.

Junior High School Trip to New Zealand

On the 14th of January Kosei Gakuen Girls' Junior High School's entire 9th grade class set off for a week long school trip in New Zealand. After a direct flight, it was straight on to the Waitomo Caves, one of the North Island's most popular tourist destinations. The students spent two nights staying on farms in the Waikato area. This gave them the opportunity to practice their English and learn more about family life in New Zealand. Here they visited the famous Auckland Domain before meeting up with some local university students for a guided tour of the University of Auckland. However, nine of the students stayed behind as part of the 2nd "JHS Study Abroad Program." These students are currently studying at local schools in the Auckland area, and will return home before they become high school students in April.

In order to tell their teachers and family members about all of the fun they had during their school trip, the students made PowerPoint presentations in English talking about their experience. A special gathering was held on the 24th of February so that the students could share these presentations. It was wonderful to see the students speaking in English with a new found confidence and to hear their memories of this truly exciting trip.
