[問題 B]

Luka は日本の中学生の女の子です。今日は、Luka の学校にシンガポールからの留学生が一日学校体験に来ます。Luka は留学生のパートナーとして、一緒に過ごします。一時間目は習字 (calligraphy) です。2人の会話を聞き、英文の内容が合っていれば○、間違っていれば×を解答欄に書きなさい。会話は2回放送されます。

(Luka is a Japanese junior high school student. Today, she will be a partner and guide for a student from Singapore who is visiting her school for a one-day study-abroad experience. Their first class is calligraphy.)

Luka: Hello, Jane! Welcome to our school. I'm Luka. I'll be your partner for today's activities.

Jane: Hi, Luka! Thank you very much. I'm really excited to learn about your school and make new friends.

Luka: That's great! Do you like Japanese culture?

Jane: Yes, I like it very much. I want to try as many things as possible.

Luka: Perfect! It will be a busy day, but let's have fun together.

Let me check the schedule for today. Our first class starts at 8:45, right after morning

Jane: What subject do we have first?

Luka: The first class is calligraphy. After that, we have Japanese language, physical education, history, then lunch, and finally art.

Jane: Wow, I'm excited but a little nervous.

Luka: Don't worry. I'll help you with everything. You'll do great.

Jane: Thank you, Luka! I hope I can write good calligraphy.

Luka: This is the calligraphy room. Here are the tools: the brush, called "fude," and the ink, called "sumi". We put a special paper "hanshi" on a felt mat.

Jane: Do you have to write very carefully?

Luka: Yes, that is important. Calligraphy is not only about writing hiragana and kanji but it's also about showing your feelings when you use the brush.

Jane: That's amazing! I have never thought writing could be like art. (pause)

Students are writing hiragana and kanji from the top to the bottom. That's different from English.

Luka: Yes, Japanese is often written like this, especially in calligraphy.

Jane: I didn't know that. It's beautiful and unique. Do Japanese people like writing words or sentences like this?

Luka: Sometimes, yes. But in everyday life, like emails or signs, writing from left to right is more common.

Jane: You use different styles for different situations. That's interesting.

Luka: Now, let's write the kanji for "river." It's written like three lines.

Jane: Why does it have three lines?

Luka: The three lines look like the flow of water in a river. Many kanji come from pictures or symbols, so they have meanings behind their shapes.

Jane: Many kanji have stories behind them.

Luka: Yes, learning kanji is like learning history and art together. Some kanji even tell old stories about nature or daily life in Japan.

Jane: That makes learning kanji much more fun!

Luka: Exactly! Today, we will try a few more kanji with simple shapes. You'll enjoy it.
